Tribal Code 2–1–910. False reports to law enforcement officers

- (1) A person commits the offense of giving false reports to law enforcement officers by knowingly
 - (a) giving false information to any law enforcement officer with the purpose to implicate another,
 - (b) reporting to a law enforcement officer an offense or other incident within their concern, knowing that the alleged offense or incident did not occur, or
 - (c) pretending to furnish such officers with information relating to an offense or incident when the person does not have information relating to such offense or incident.
- (2) Giving false reports to law enforcement officers is a Class C offense over which the Tribes have exclusive jurisdiction.

Montana Code 45-7-205. False reports to law enforcement authorities.

- (1) A person commits an offense under this section if the person knowingly:
 - (a) gives false information to any law enforcement officer with the purpose to implicate another;
 - (b) reports to law enforcement authorities an offense or other incident within their concern knowing that it did not occur; or
 - (c) pretends to furnish law enforcement authorities with information relating to an offense or incident when the person knows that the person has no information relating to the offense or incident.
- (2) A person convicted under this section shall be fined not to exceed \$500 or be imprisoned in the county jail for any term not to exceed 6 months, or both.
